ICLS Heavenly Directress: *The Immaculate Heart of Mary*

ICLS is consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Institute belongs to Mother Mary who is the model for consecrated life. We submit to her Immaculate Heart every ICLS initiative for the renewal and revisioning of consecrated life and the ongoing formation of consecrated men and women.

ICLS Patron: *St Anthony Mary Claret*

ICLS is a missionary initiative of the Congregation of Missionaries Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (*Cordis Mariae Filii* – CMF) a.k.a. Claretian Missionaries founded on July 16, 1849 by Archbishop Anthony Mary Claret in Spain. One of the core initiatives of St Claret was to effect renewal in priesthood and consecrated life.



ICLS Guardians: *Blessed Claretian Martyrs of Barbastro*

ICLS considers Bl. Felipe de Jesús Munárriz Azcona and companions – *the fifty-one martyrs of the “Martyr Seminary” of Barbastro* who gave up their lives in 1936, as its Guardians – protectors and promoters. It was the prayer and promise of these 51 young men that their blood would course through the veins of their brothers in the Congregation to fulfil the missionary dream they could not realize on this side of life.

ICLS VISION

ICLS envisions to be a premier institute for the *renewal and revisioning of consecrated life in the Church* with a special focus on South Asia, by offering specialized studies in the theology of consecrated life and diverse short- and long-term offline and online courses for the upskilling of the consecrated, in shared mission with those committed to the cause of consecrated life.

ICLS MISSION

To facilitate study, reflection, and research in the theology and formation of consecrated life in its biblical, historical, theological, and anthropological dimensions, clarifying its identity and mission in the Church and the world, in dialogue with other Christian forms of life and the pluriform religious faith traditions of Asia, and living out the experience within an inter-congregational ambience and missionary spirituality.

CLARETIAN INSTITUTES OF CONSECRATED LIFE

Claretian Missionaries are committed to helping consecrated men and women realize their mission in the world. To this effect, Claretians have founded six institutes of consecrated life (*Claretianum* in Rome, *ITVR* in Madrid, *ICLA* in Manila, *ICLS* in Bengaluru, *INCLA* in Abuja [Nigeria], and *ITVCA* in Bogotá [Colombia]), with the specific mission of renewal and revisioning of consecrated life and ongoing formation and skilling of the consecrated.

The Church treasures consecrated life as “a gift of God the Father to his Church through the Holy Spirit” (*Vita Consecrata* 1) and calls it to be a “ray of divine beauty” (VC 109) and “a spiritual therapy” for humanity (VC 87). Claretian ICLs enable the consecrated by educating them in the theology of consecrated life and upskilling them to tend the lives of those on the social and existential peripheries of the society so that “they may have life, life in its fullness” (John 10:10) and thereby contribute to building up “an authentic civilization of truth and love” (*Evangelium Vitae*, 6).

INSTITUTE OF CONSECRATED LIFE – SANYASA (ICLS)

ICLS, founded in 2002 at Carmelaram, Bengaluru, India, as the fourth of the Claretian institutes of consecrated life, is the one and only such institute in India, offering licentiate (under Pontifical Lateran University, Rome) and diploma in the theology of consecrated life and several short, intensive, online and offline courses for the upskilling of the consecrated. Contextualizing consecrated life in the Asian setting, *ICLS* offers various academic and ongoing formation programs for deepening the understanding of the consecrated form of life in the Church especially in the light of the Scripture, the Magisterium, the Tradition and various theological interpretations with the scope of empowering consecrated persons.

ICLS OBJECTIVES

- a) To provide for the systematic study of the theology of consecrated life in the Church, its theological foundations, meaning, relevance, and role in the present time.
- b) To engage in scientific investigation into the theology of consecrated life and disseminate the findings.
- c) To equip the consecrated with skills and resources to teach, train, and guide others in initial and on-going formation as well as in theological institutes.
- d) To help the consecrated to deepen the sense of their theological identity and mission in the Church and the society.
- e) To deepen the consecrated in a life of witness to the Gospel and evangelical counsels.
- f) To upskill the consecrated with adequate theological revisioning and competence for initiating new and radical forms of ministries at the service of humanity.

INTENSIVE PREPARATORY FOR PERPETUAL PROFESSION (IPPP-in-Forge Key)



Duration : 3 months (2025 January 5 - March 30).
Eligibility : Open to candidates preparing for perpetual profession.
Medium of Instruction : English

What is “Forge Key?”

Forge refers to the comprehensive formative/renewal paradigm developed by Claretian missionaries, inspired by the charismatic formative experience of their founder, Saint Anthony Mary Claret (1807-1870). In a deeply mystical experience, he found himself being formed in the forge of the Heart of Mary, to be transformed into an arrow poised to be released to evangelize the world. Claretians have evolved the *Forge* as a comprehensive formative paradigm, in the spirit of *Vita Consecrata*, applicable to all consecrated men and women. The diagram below captures dynamics of the *Forge Encounter* tailor-made for the *initial formation* as well as for the *ongoing deepening* of one’s religious consecration. The *Forge Encounter* unfolds in 0+3 phases, with the dynamics of each phase correlated to each person of the Trinity.

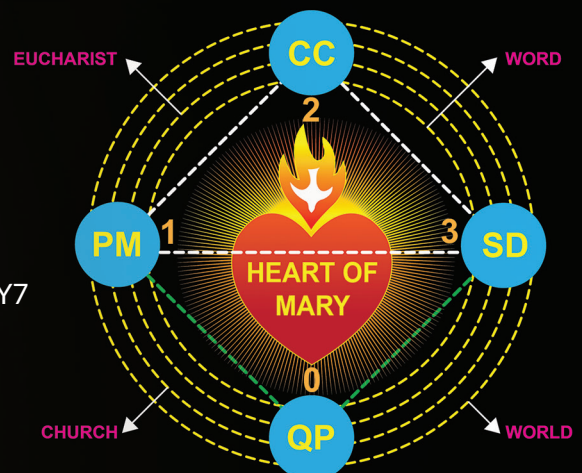
Outcome of the IPPP-in-Forge Key Experience

- A lived experience of the Trinitarian foundation of one’s consecration, with a deepening of intimacy with the Persons of the Trinity.
- Greater maturity in affective domain and growth in psycho-sexual and psycho-spiritual integration, aimed at deepening of one’s inner freedom to profess the evangelical counsels.
- Greater personal agency to live one’s consecration with integrity and creativity.
- Substantial grounding in the theology of consecrated life.
- Foundation for joyful community living as witnesses of the Kin(g)dom.
- Skilling in discernment and various forms of prayer.

ONE-MONTH INTENSIVE COURSE IN THEOLOGY OF CONSECRATED LIFE



Duration : 1 month (2025 April 30 [Wednesday evening] to May 30 [Friday afternoon]).

Eligibility : Open to any professed religious, priests, laity.

Medium of Instruction : English

Course Features:

This is a condensed form of the one-year diploma course on the theology of consecrated life (TCL). It is offered as an alternative for those who are unable to spare a whole year for renewal programs or specifically for studying TCL. This course is ideal for those desiring a deeper reflection and renewed theological understanding of consecrated life, a brief renewal experience, jubilarians, and those preparing for final profession.

Learning Outcomes

Having participated actively in this course, the participants will have:

- Explored the theory and dynamics of the *theology of consecrated life* enabling them to deepen their convictions and commitment.
- Identified and developed skills and tools to live their consecration authentically.
- Learned fundamental principles of consecrate life from biblical, historical, spiritual, psychological, theological, dogmatic, missionary, formative, and evangelical perspectives.
- Had a lived and shared inter-cultural experience of being part of a learning community of missionaries who engage in collaborative learning and reflection.

FORMATIVE ACCOMPANIMENT: THEORY AND PRACTICUM (FATP)



<i>Duration</i>	: Two-month online (2024 June-July) + 18 days' residential workshop (2024 August 11 evening to August 28 noon).
<i>Eligibility</i>	: Open to priests and religious 25 years and above, with reasonable command in English and who are either formators or are being prepared for formation ministry.
<i>Medium of Instruction</i>	: English

Course Description

FATP introduces the participants to the theory and practice of formative processes, utilizing advanced learning methods, contributions of andragogy, and transformative learning, together with the insights from 2,000 years of spiritual patrimony of the Church.

The course primarily draws on the Six Category Intervention Approaches as developed by John Heron, and is further integrated with scriptural insights and principles of consecrated life, counselling skills, rules of discernment, community dynamics, etc., aimed at preparing skilled and effective formators.

Learning Outcomes of FATP

Having participated actively in this course, the formation personnel will have:

- Explored the theory and practice of accompaniment in formation ministry so as to be better equipped to work in initial and ongoing formation.
- Identified, practiced, and developed skills and tools for formative accompaniment.
- Learned various intervention models to assist candidates in different moments in their formative journey.
- Had a lived experience of being part of a learning community of formation personnel who engage in collaborative learning and reflection.
 - Initiated preliminary steps for creating peer support groups which could evolve into ongoing support network of formation personnel.

Course Description

Pope Francis has made “discernment” one of the key concerns of his papacy and called upon religious congregations to develop a culture of discerning leadership. Such leadership involves exercising the service of authority in a synodal, responsible, and transparent way at all levels (ecclesial, congregational, provincial and local). ICLS offers DLW-C specially targeting consecrated men and women with leadership responsibilities, in order to train them in the theory and practice of Discerning Leadership, after the heart of the Good Shepherd, to become leaders with the smell of the sheep.

Course Description & Objectives:

The Church has called upon all her constituents to make protection of minors and vulnerable adults an urgent priority in ministry. In response to this call, ICLS has been offering this course since 2019. The course targets those in the ministry of children and vulnerable adults, especially teachers and formators, to be informed and equipped to protect and empower children and vulnerable adults. The course has the following objectives:

- To create a world where minors and vulnerable persons are safer.
- To raise awareness and provide formation for prevention of child sexual abuse.
- To train to help victims overcome the trauma of childhood sexual abuse.
- To promote preventive measures in various ministries and institutions.
- To deepen knowledge of the Church and State Laws (such as POCSO Act).
